EL HIERRO

If you like Philippe Starck, you'll love El Hierro — the minimalist's island of black sand and alien landscapes is far removed from lager-and-chips Tenerife. Finca Wapa, in El Gollo, is a self-catering cottage sleeping three, built from black volcanic rock and close to the capital, Tigaday, as well as the natural swimming pools at La Maceta. A week costs £832 with Secret Destinations (020 8941 6588, www.secretdestinations.com). EasyJet (0843 104 5000, easyjet.com) flies to Tenerife; from there, the interisland airline BinterCanarias (00 34 902 391392, www.bintercanarias.com) can drop you in El Hierro.

LA GOMERA

Visible from Tenerife, La Gomera isn't quite as remote as El Hierro, but if you're looking for Canarian sunshine without Canarian mass tourism, this is the spot. You'll find

LANZAROTE

Prefer a little less conservation and a little more action? Lanzarote can be grotty, but the five-star Princesa Yalza Suite Hotel Resort, on Playa Blanca, bucks the trend, not just by having six pools, sophisticated bars and a spa, but through its membership of the slow-food movement. Until Christmas, Carlos Perez and Paolo Soggiu, who oversee the resort's eight restaurants, will be running gourmet workshops (£80 for three hours). MADEIRA

The Hotel Moniz Sol lies on the northwestern tip of the island, with its stupendous sea views echoed by the collection of modern art within. Intimate yet sophisticated, it has no outdoor pool: everybody goes to the gorgeous natural rock pools in Porto Moniz, two minutes down the road. The *levada* walking is particularly good here, and the hotel has a free Turkish bath, sauna and steam room for when you find your way back. 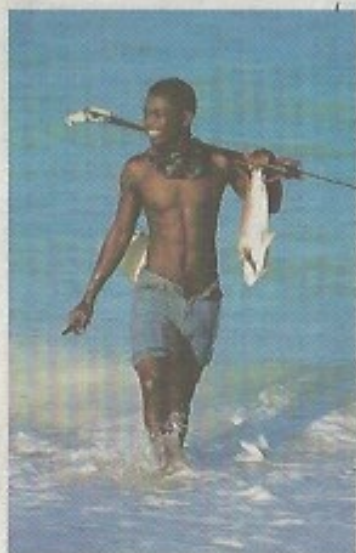

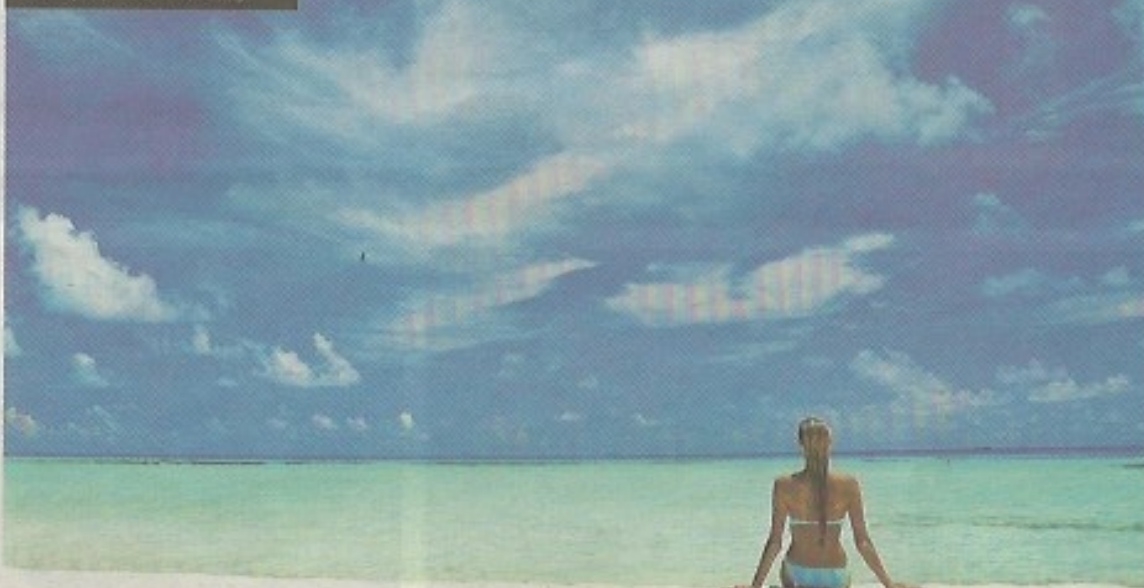

**BORNEO**

Gaya Island Resort is a new luxury resort built on a tropical islet off the north coast of Borneo. It has a pool, a spa village, a private retreat on a remote paradise beach and a programme of activities designed for explorers, with a resident marine biologist and a jungle guide waiting to satisfy your curiosity. Audley (01993 838100, audleytravel.com) has eight nights from £1,980pp, including a room upgrade.

VIETNAM

Two years ago, Lang Co was a tiny fishing village squeezed between a green lagoon and the South China Sea. Now, it's the home of Asia's hottest new hotel, the Banyan Tree Laguna Lang Co, which opens on November 1. Expect world-class restaurants, an 18-hole golf course, a spa, two miles of white sand and a choice of beach-pool or lagoon-pool villas. Because it's new, it's a deal: a week starts at £2,630pp with Carrier (0161 492 1358, carrier.co.uk)

CAMBODIA

Five-star resorts are going up all over Cambodia, but none is as eclectic as Knai Bang Chatt, on the south coast. The three minimalist 1970s concrete-and-steel buildings that make up the hotel look like the sort James Bond infiltrates on a regular basis, but inside it's more organic — all driftwood, lotus flowers and smiling girls. If you're looking for a resort experience, however, you'll be disappointed. Instead, come

for pampering, privacy and utter relaxation. A six-night break costs £1,382pp with Travelbag (0871 703 4698, travelbag.co.uk).

BALI

Less than 15 miles up the coast from Kuta, between the rice terraces and a sparkly black-sand beach, is the Alila Villas Soori. If you're looking for romance, this is the place: it combines Balinese serenity, hugely distracting views across the straits of Java, techy mod cons and some of the best service you'll ever experience. A week starts at £2,725pp with Ampersand Travel (020 7289 6100, ampersandtravel.com).

THAILAND

Lastly, a top Thai tip: the Saboey Resort and Villas, on Bangrak beach, in Bophut, on Ko Samui, is a three-star hideaway that deserves five for service and serenity. It has just 18 villas and suites, an infinity pool and a small restaurant set in lush tropical gardens. The suites are big and airy, with hardwood floors and rattan furniture — if the place isn't busy when you check in, ask to upgrade to one of the two beach villas, which have their own stretch of sand. A week starts at £1,119pp with Tropical Sky (0843 636 7845, tropicalsky.co.uk).
